Ongoing Food Distribution Program











As we celebrated our 5th anniversary, our commitment to our food distribution program remained stronger than ever. This program is central to our mission, ensuring that families in Montgomery and Baltimore Counties have consistent access to fresh, nutritious, and culturally appropriate foods—helping our communities thrive.

In August, we continued these vital efforts with several distribution events. On August 16 and 23, we served over 180 clients at Aspen Hill, providing fresh produce like pumpkins from our Poolesville Farm and tomatoes from Sandy Spring Gardens. On August 22, we reached 40 families in Essex/Baltimore with essential items like cooking oil, rice, and culturally appropriate fresh vegetables. *These ongoing efforts are crucial in supporting the well-being of our community members, and we are proud to play a role in helping them thrive.*



Green Castle Elementary School Resource Fair (August 23, 2024)

On the same day as our second Aspen Hill event, we participated in the Green Castle Elementary School Resource Fair.

The event brought together 300-400 parents, students, partners, and donors, all eager to learn about the resources available to them.

While we made great connections, we also recognized the need for better table placement to ensure we reach as many families as possible in future events.

It was a valuable lesson in how the little things—like where we set up—can

have a big impact.

We closed the month with an enriching day at our Poolesville Farm. The Fall Community Garden Day was intimate and impactful. Attendees included our CEO and dedicated volunteers.
